Sportsmanship always begins with me, the coach. I will be honest and fair with my players. I will find ways to genuinely encourage each player and promote a positive encouraging spirit between players.

I will respect all players, coaches and umpires on the field and teach my players to respect their team mates and their opponents. I will refrain from and actively suppress derogatory comments, negative cheering or chanting which intentionally or unintentionally distracts or demeans opposing players.

I understand that good sportsmanship is everyone's responsibility, but I am more responsible than anyone for setting the tone and the attitude of my team.

I will confront inappropriate behavior when exhibited between my players or directed toward opposition players.

I will remember that mercy and compassion in the context of playing hard and playing fair does not require a rule, and the lessons of sportsmanship last a lifetime.

I will remember that these girls and young women are here to have fun and enjoy the friendships of others. This is a recreational league which encourages the participation of all who seek to play; and players have a wide variety of skills and softball knowledge. In this environment, encouraging sportsmanship and a positive attitude toward team mates and opponents, regardless of ability, is the most important fundamental of the game.
